What is this product?

Type The company is a closed-ended investment company, whose shares have a premium listing on the London Stock Exchange (LSE) and an alternative investment fund under the Alternative Investment Fund Managers Directive. The

Company's ordinary shares are therefore available to the general public.

Term

This product has no maturity date or fixed term of existence. In certain circumstances it may be wound up by the directors and shareholders of the Company, subject to compliance with it's articles of association and applicable laws.

The Company may not be unilaterally terminated by the Manager.

Shares of the Company are bought and sold on the London Stock Exchange. Typically, there is a spread between the

price at which you may purchase and sell a share at any given time on the London Stock Exchange.

Objectives

The Company's dual objectives are to preserve shareholders' real wealth and to achieve absolute total returns over the medium to longer term. The Company aims to achieve its investment objectives through long only investment in

quoted closed-ended funds and other collective investment vehicles, bonds, commodities and cash as considered appropriate. It is anticipated that under most market conditions, a broad mix of assets will be maintained and a maximum 80% exposure to either equity or fixed-interest securities may be held at any time. The Company does not have a formal benchmark but uses the UK Retail Price Index as the minimum target for returns to be achieved over the medium to longer term. The investment manager will limit the use of derivative instruments to convertible bonds

and warrants

Intended Investor The Company is suitable for all investors seeking a fund that aims to deliver growth and income with a long term

investment horizon as the core or a component of a portfolio of investments. The stock market provides ready access to the investment. The investor should be prepared to bear losses up to the amount invested in the Company. The

Company is compatible for mass market distribution.

What are the risks and what could you get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

Recommended holding period: 5 years
